Suggested itinerary: Start the day off in Carousel Plaza and ride the two-story historic Columbia Carousel. Admire the hundreds of flowers as well as the look on the faces of your group as they experience this famous carousel. Take a group photo near the reflecting pool as a memento of the day's fun.

Head over to Sky Trek Tower where on a clear day you can see the skyline of Chicago.

Next, drive an old-fashioned car at Great America Raceway; the parasol and high-button shoes can be left at home.
